Call to Order

A quorum was declared and the meeting was called to order by Chairman Eddinger at 7:00 pm. All in attendance rose to salute the flag and repeat together the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes

After a review of the minutes from the November 8, 2021 meeting, there was a motion to approve by Commissioner Scott, seconded by Commissioner Uzzolina. Approval of the minutes as presented were passed unanimously.

Rick Howard introduced Senator Vickie Sawyer and thanked her for her support of the marine commission. She presented us with a \$100,000 of grant money from the State of NC.

Public Hearing on No Wake Buoy Permit Application

Rick Howard thanked Billy Wilson for his commitment to the No Wake Buoy Committee over the past year and introduced him to present the new No Wake Buoy Permit Application. 10-12 volunteers were part of the committee which consisted of a lot of research, contact with multiple agencies and community input. Commissioners were given a copy of the recommended application. The committee recommends and requests the following...

- 1) Repeal current No Wake Buoy Application
- 2) Adopt a new No Wake Buoy Application (attached). Billy Wilson reviewed the application line by line to further clarify for the commission and the public.
 - a. Line 5 recommends a Buoy Review Committee consisting of the Commissioner who is assigned to the No Wake Buoy Committee as chair and 2 additional individuals.
 - b. Line 8 would require that an approved buoy be entered into the NC Administrative Code

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC ON NO WAKE BUOY PERMIT APPLICATIAON

 Ron Shoultz thanked the committee and the commission for their efforts. He recommended the following...

Line 1 Add contact information including phone number and email address

Line 2 Include GPS coordinates for placement of buoy

Commission received 6 emails – 5 supported and 1 opposed

Committee Reports:

Executive Director

John Gerke reported for Morris Sample...

- The current lake level is 95.8 ft and will likely continue to decrease over the next couple of months. The Catawba Wateree Water Management Group has indicated that they will likely move into Phase 0 of the drought monitoring program in the near future. This calls for increased public awareness of potential drought conditions and recommends water saving activities. Mandatory water restrictions begin at Phase 2. This determination is based on lake level, stream water flow monitors and precipitation forecasts.
- Please be aware that as we move into winter months, some areas that were navigable in the summer may be dangerous at the lower lake level. Shoal markers do not cover all the areas that should be avoided at lower lake levels.
- As we begin to have colder temperatures, the lake water temperature will decrease significantly
 with current surface temperatures in the mid-50's. Survival in colder temperature below mid-50's
 is difficult without cold weather survival gear. Hypothermia is a real danger to anyone that is
 submerged in this colder water for any length of time. Anyone on the water in winter months
 should be accompanied by another boater.
- Our plan is for future meetings to be in person pending any changes to COVID restrictions at Charles Mack.

LNMC Minutes continued Cornelius Police Department

Officers responded to 9 calls for service during the month of November. These calls for service were on the lake only. The most calls for service were received on Monday. Calls for service were most often reported between the hours of **12:00pm-06:00pm**. Lake Officers conducted 3 vessel stops with 1 State Citation and 2 written warnings issued. The average response time to calls for service was **4.55 minutes**. Officers self initiated 568 zone checks.

November Highlights:

Lake Corporal Mutarelli trained and certified in drone use. This will add an additional capabilities to Lake Patrol.

Cub Scout Den 72 did a tour of the boat house/boats. A short patrol was conducted with the scouts including a demonstration of vessel performance. Various safety topics were discussed during the experience.
