Officer Clauson with Lake Patrol reported several navigational hazards and 2 B&E's. Recommended keeping valuables secure.

Iredell County Sheriff

Officer Finch reported 3 calls for service for suspicious people in November and 4 in December. Most were duck hunters. 29 assists. 1 larceny after the water came back up when kayaks were reported missing. These were located. 270 hours on the water. 9 citations in November and December combined. 1 charge for hunter harassment. Many calls for navigational hazards. Plane crash near the water and the

pilot passed away due to injuries sustained in the crash. Received 2nd Safe Boat with grant funds. Decrease in all incidents as patrolling has increased.

Brandon Jones reported the floating classroom should be ready to request their permit next month. Website is up and running and taking reservations. Data report to be released on January 20th. Increased bacteria after large rainfalls so recommended avoiding the water for a few days after.

Billy Wilson reported planted 150 of 300 button bushes in November. The planting of the remaining bushes has been delayed due to the water being too high. Will reschedule in the spring. HEP grant will fund a rock reef at Patriots Pier. Looking for funding to T the existing pier to allow additional access. For the 5th year 300+ Christmas Trees will be dropped in the lake for fish habitats. Thank you for Safe Harbor Skippers Marina for storing the trees and Lancaster Custom Dock for use of their barge. Osprey nest on the ATON's. The plan is to reduce the number of additional platforms and deter nesting with the use of excluders. There are 7-8 that need to be protected from nesting this spring. Plans are in the works to get this completed before nesting season.

Environmental/Hydrilla Committee

Committee Chairman Bob Vandola reported first meeting Thursday, January 11th. Lyngba, eel grass and water quality monitoring will all be on the agenda for discussion. Currently there are 6 members. There is still capacity to expand the committee. Results of the meeting will be presented at the marine commission next month. The Hydrilla Committee is a separate committee led by DEQ and will be meeting later this month.

Chairman Rick Howard reported a group of local mayors and others from Troutman to Charlotte have environmental concerns and are working together to address issues and prevent further issues. Everyone is doing a great job working together to be proactive. Submit any suggestions to rhoward@lnmc.org.

Boater Education/Communication

- · Since our last meeting, the Marine Commission members and I have participated in several meetings including

o the Catawba -Wateree Management Group's Drought Management Advisory Group (and yes we are still in Stage 1 of their Low Inflow Protocol); the next meeting is tomorrow

o their Integrated Water Resources Plan working committee on 14 December. This is a multi-year study to develop water management strategies and tools considering many economic and environmental facors for the long term (through 2100)

o The December 13 meeting of the group working on the 2025 updates to the Catawba – Wateree Shoreline Management Plan. This Shoreline Management Plan (SMP) is basically the guidelines for any construction, shoreline stabilization or modifications, marinas, etc that touch the shores of any Duke Lake in the FERC project. If you would like to review the document and submit ideas for revisions please contact your Commissioner. The next meeting is 31 January.

- · Another upcoming meeting this month is the NC DEQ Weed Council aka the Lake Norman Aquatic Weed Management Project on January 22. More about this later from Bob Van Dolah.
- · We will be participating in the Mid-Atlantic Boat Show at the Charlotte Convention Center February 8-11. There will be over thirty boat dealers and many other lake-related vendors there so mark your calendars.

On-water activities are generally scheduled in 1-2 weeks in advance; emergency callout procedures can be invoked if needed.

- Activities continue to install a USCG Auxiliary Fixed Land VHF Marine Radio Station. Location is Blythe Landing
 Park. A grant application to the Duke Energy Foundation has been approved and funding on the way.
 Conversations continue with Medklenburg Parks on administrative tasks. The approach to the antenna will be to
 install a utility pole with antennas mounted on top; a utility pole contractor has been identified and has agreed
 to perform the work. The goal is to have the radio station up and running before boating season.
